Ms. Kapoor writes: "I am struggling to string words together to make sense of all that is going on across the world. All I can think of is our children, our hope for a more humane tomorrow. Unfortunately, ISIS, too, is looking at children. It wants to recruit children into its evil doctrine. So, our counter 'indoctrination' needs to bear the wisdom of farsighted consequences. I do not believe violence met with more violence can ever create true peace. All we

have to fall back on is our humanity. It is this power of reasoning and empathy that we need to evoke in our children. And, I believe there is another critical ingredient-imagination.

So, in my small way, with Junoon, I contribute to this world by working with children. I am in the midst of weekend worships in Gurgaon with children aged nine to twelve. In the midst of all this gloom, I get such energy from this work... One of the most amazing moments was when Ajay spoke about his work as a filmmaker with Seeds of Peace, an organization that works at conflict resolution with youth from hostile regions. Ajay shared his experience in Palestine--the birthplace of three major religions of the world, namely Judaism, Christianity and Islam, and yet it had been in a state of conflict for a millennia. He asked the children to do some research on this and try to understand the causes for this state of turmoil. Clearly, this is not a school that shies away from the stark reality of our

times, and values its role as a holistic educator...

A few days later, I was overwhelmed at the warmth and sense of hope I experienced at a



reception of the Freedom Theatre School students at the Palestinian Embassy in Delhi. Six students with two teachers from Jenin in Palestine, are working with Jana Natya Manch (JANAM) to create a street theatre piece that will travel across eleven cities later this year. Both these unique theatre organizations have lost their leader to brutal assassinations... today both these groups collaborate to sow seeds of peace and greater understanding across countries..."

Tent Confessions draw Youth to Sacrament in South Korea

On December 17 a line of 30 tents outside Myeongdong Cathedral caught the attention of tourists and intrigued passerby. As one of the celebrations for the Jubilee of Mercy and Advent, the "Sacrament of Reconciliation for Young People" aimed to provide young Catholics the opportunity of confession not in a traditional confessional, but outdoor confessional tents. The event began at 7:30pm, with the "Time of Reflection" inside Myeongdong Cathedral. At the same time, Bible readings and Taizé hymns were played throughout the 30-minute ceremony. Then young people were led by volunteers one by one for confession. 30 priest, 50 volunteers, and 450 young people participated in the event. Cardinal Andrew Yeom Soo-Jung and Bishop Peter Chung Soon-Taek took part in hearing the confession. Zenit.org
