For a Christian, just as for everyone else, there will be incompleteness, illness, death, senseless hurt, broken dreams, cold, hungry, lonely days of bitterness and a lifetime of inconsummation. Reality can be harsh and Christmas does not ask us to make make-believe. The

incarnation does not promise heaven on earth. It promises heaven in heaven. Here, on earth, it promises us something else God's presence in our lives. This presence redeems because knowing that God is with us is what ultimately empowers us to give up bitterness, to forgive, and to move beyond cynicism and bitterness. When God is with us then pain and happiness are not mutually exclusive and the agonies and riddles of life do not exclude deep meaning and deep joy."

With its central theme of 'preparing the way of the Lord', Advent becomes an invitation to understand that everyday events are signs of the attention that God has for us. Advent invites and stimulates us to contemplate the ever present Lord. The certainty of his presence helps us to see the world with different eyes and to consider the whole of our existence as a "visit" of God that comes and stays near us in every situation. The Scripture readings during Advent

are full of hope. They are an



antidote to the cynicism and despair so prevalent in our age. They are worth reading and reflection. If Advent emphasizes the longing, excitement, joy, and yearning for what is to come, then Christmas celebrates the wonder of the Emmanuel in Jesus Christ, the Incarnation, which is the greatest miracle of all the ages. 11th Holy Eucharistic Procession at Agartala

The 11th Holy Eucharistic

The Executive Committee of Catholic Laity of Tripura (CLT) had distributed prayer leaflets for the success of the procession as well as the 24 hours Adoration for the success of the holy Eucharistic procession.

Though there was a slight drizzle in the morning hours on 10th November, the program started off well. The Holy Eucharist was presided by Most Rev. Bishop Lumen Monteiro along with the

Clergy of the Diocese. Rev. Bishop in his homily exhorted the people to bear witness to Christ and be rooted in faith, even when there are adverse situations in our lives. The mild shower at the beginning of holy Mass gained momentum at the time of Holy Communion. It was so bad that we had to cancel the Eucharistic procession. Yet there was Praise and Worship before the Blessed Sacrament led Fr. Jeevan SVD, while by now the rains poured down and the people used umbrellas. At the culmination of the Praise & Worship with Benediction, the heavy shower and wind stimulated the collapse of the *pandal* and *shamiana*. It was very nice to see a huge crowd of more than 4,000 people who came to participate and devotionally attend the Eucharistic celebration and worship, despite the rain and inclement weather. Children can become cannibals by eating chicken eggs

Gopal Bhargava, a senior politician of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in Madhya Pradesh, made the claim last week as he opposed a Government plan to include eggs in school midday meals to fight malnutrition. "If children are given non-vegetarian food, they may turn into cannibals," Bhargava reportedly said. The Hindu culture prohibits eating non-vegetarian food, said Bhargava, the leader of the opposition in the State legislature. If children are fed eggs and other non-vegetarian food from childhood, "they will eat meat and may grow up to become *narbhakshi* (cannibals)," Bhargava added.

Archbishop Leo Cornelio of Bhopal, based in the State capital, said such attitudes of politicians linking food with religion and culture "do not augur well for democracy... This is a sorry state when politicians give religious color to food," Archbishop Cornelio told ucanews.

Government statistics show that some 44 percent of Indian children under the age of five are malnourished, and Madhya Pradesh has the highest level at 70 percent. At least 56 percent of children in all age groups are also anemic, published records show.

"We will oppose any such proposal. I think this is an attempt to interfere with the religious beliefs and faith of the people," said Kailash Vijayvargiya, a former Minister. But Minister Devi told media that she and her Government would proceed. "I don't care if the BJP is protesting," she said, adding that "egg remains a simple and easy way to help children grow healthy."

Archbishop Cornelio said "thoughtless statements of responsible politicians make the entire country a laughing stock before the entire world."
