Habemus Papam

Habemus Papam "We have a Pope" announced the Proto Deacon, Cardinal Jean-Louis Tauran. And the name of the man to emerge on the balcony in Vatican City is Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio of Argentina. The 265th Successor of Saint Peter will go by the name of Pope Francis and is the first non-European Pope in modern times, the first Jesuit Pope in history and the first from a developing country. The much-awaited choice is something of a surprise, as the new Pope was not foreshadowed prominently on the short lists of various experts, though the 76-year old was said to be a close second to retiring Pope Benedict in the 2005 conclave.

Cardinal Bergoglio, a Jesuit intellectual who reportedly eschews the ornate trappings of church power he travels by bus was elected in a swift five votes of a conclave of 115 cardinals, and immediately appeared to say the Lord's Prayer to crowds on the Vatican plaza.

A recent biography "Pope Francis" written by Mathew Bunson makes interesting reading: "On February 11, 2013, Pope Benedict XVI stunned the world when he announced that he was resigning the papacy and that the College of Cardinals would gather in Rome to elect his successor. Halfway across the world, Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, the archbishop of Buenos Aires, Argentina, prepared for his journey to Rome and the conclave. He bought a return ticket, and his friends, aghast at the state of his battered old shoes, implored him to accept the gift of a new pair. Wearing his new shoes, he set out for the Vatican.

Two journeys one for the whole Church and another for one of her members ended in the chapel filled with the frescoes of Michelangelo, beneath the gaze of the "Last Judgment."

On March 13, the College of Cardinals elected Cardinal Bergoglio to serve as the 265th Successor of Peter.

As pontiff, Francis stands now truly as the bridge builder. His origins, his learning, and his own years of service as a pastor over a city that has some of the wealthiest residents in South America and some of the poorest has prepared him for this role. He was a shepherd to them all, and he labored to help everyone in his care encounter Christ. And now he will work to do the same for the world.

We see in the election of Pope Francis the loving and merciful hand of God's providence. As he told the reporters who had been covering the memorable events unfolding in Rome: "In everything that has occurred, the principal agent has been, in the final analysis, the Holy Spirit. He prompted the decision of Benedict XVI for the good of the Church; he guided the cardinals in prayer and in the election." Long live Pope Francis! **+Lumen, CSC**

The Size of our Families

While discussing vocations, the subject of 'small families' came up at the recent Pastoral Council meeting of the Diocese. It is a subject that has implications beyond vocations.

A visitor to Tripura seldom fails to note the size of its families. It is small, for sure. Tripura's indigenous communities, especially certain tribes, seem to have proven wrong the notion that tribal communities tend to have large families.



Despite small families becoming the order of the day in most places and countries, it is intriguing that tribal communities here have so vigorously responded to the government-sponsored 'small family happy family' campaign. Intriguing because in the state of Tripura, numbers are everything past, present, future, identity and destiny of its people.

The size of families has a connection with land too. 'Land' has been at the centre of all the ethnic conflicts that happened and still lie latent in this land. The indigenous community needs to realize that land, all land, unless inhabited and cared for, simply goes away. Present-day tribal families, many of which have only one child or two at the most, seem hardly equipped to deal with this challenge.

Although one assumes it to be the result of education and enlightenment, the small family syndrome could in reality be a symptom of a deeper malaise afflicting the community a tendency to hedonism and abandonment. The anti-life base on which small families are often built could wreck the moral fabric of the society and also forfeit blessings of God.

It is highly probable that most children of small families will, finally, turn out to be spoiled brats, but they are still lucky because they got to be born. If only they would extend that chance to whomever God

Pope Francis decides to stay in Domus Sanctae Martae

Fr. Federico Lombardi, informed journalists that Pope Francis has decided for the time being to stay in the Domus Sanctae Martae house rather than move into the papal apartments. The cardinal electors reside at the Domus Sanctae Martae during conclave. Once a Pope is chosen, the newly elected Pontiff transfers to a slightly larger room- Suite 201 - until preparations are finished in the papal apartments. Fr. Lombardi stated that now that the Papal apartment is ready, the Holy Father has chosen instead to move to Suite 201 for the time being and will use the the papal apartment for official audiences and for his weekly Sunday Angelus address. Living at Domus Sanctae Martae, Fr.



Lombardi stated, would allow the Pope to live in a communal atmosphere with those who reside there. *Zenit.org*

The tailor who has dressed every Pope since 1922

Making bespoke clothes is tricky when you don't know who will wear them. But Gammarelli, the Roman tailor that has dressed every pope since 1922, gets around that by catering for every eventuality. Unveiled in its window on Monday were three ivory cassocks in small, medium and large a choice which it hopes will keep it covered no matter who emerges from the Sistine Chapel as the next leader of the Roman Catholic church. Alongside the robes would go a white skullcap, a red velvet cape and four or five pairs of red shoes, said Lorenzo Gammarelli, one of the business's owners.



"We are providing more than three pairs of shoes because

you can adjust a cassock or a suit but you must wear the right size shoes," he said.

Vatican Stamps Commemorate Sede Vacante

The Philatelic and Numismatic Office of the Governorate of Vatican City State has issued four stamps with the image of an angel raising the pavilion (“umbraculum”) of the Apostolic Camera, the work of Italian artist Daniela Longo. The stamps cost: €0.70 for mail to Italy, with a light green background; €0.85 for mail to Europe, with a blue background; €2.00 for mail to the Americas, with a grey background; and €2.50 for mail to Oceania, on a yellow background.

The use of these stamps as postage is only available during the Sede Vacante, ending with the election of the new Pope. Their philatelic use is allowed afterwards and the office will continue to sell them to collectors. *Zenit.org*
