a Paderewski concert. After they were seated, the mother spotted a friend in the audience and walked down the aisle to greet her. Seizing the opportunity to explore the wonders of the concert hall, the little boy rose and eventually explored his way through a

door marked "NO ADMITTANCE." When the house lights dimmed and the concert was about to begin, the mother returned to her seat and discovered that the child was missing. Suddenly, the curtains parted and spotlights focused on the impressive stage.



In horror, the mother saw her

little boy sitting at the keyboard, innocently picking out "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star." At that moment, the great piano master made his entrance, quickly moved to the piano, and whispered in the boy's ear, "Don't Quit. Keep Playing." Then leaning over, Paderewski reached down with his left hand and began filling in a bass part. Soon his right arm reached around to the other side of the child and he added a running obbligato. International Year of Family Farming - The United Nations (UN) has declared 2014 as the: International Year of Family Farming (IYFF 2014). It aims to stimulate policies for the sustainable development of farmer families, communal units, indigenous groups, cooperatives and fishing families. When the UN declared 2014 as the Year of Family Farming, it announced that family farming and smallholder farming were important for sustainable food production to achieve food security. There are an estimated 500 million family farms those that rely primarily on family members for labour and management across the developed and developing world, according to the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (<u>FAO</u>). These farms produce the food that feeds billions of people, the agency noted in a news release, adding that in many developing countries, family farms represent up to 80 per cent of all farm holdings.

Training on SRI and different Government Schemes

On 24th July JUST organized a training program assisted by Caritas India on System of Rice Intensification (SRI) at Tamakari Village under FARM Northeast Project. The objective of the training was to let the farmers know about the technique of SRI cultivation. Ms. Nirupama Debbarma (Sector Officer) Agriculture Department and Mr. Rathin Debbarma (Incharge) VLW, Barakathal, were the Resource Persons for the training. 50 farmers of different Farmers' Clubs took part in the training program. The training ended successfully with the Sector Officer saying she was thankful to JUST for organizing the training program and asked JUST Staff to keep in touch with the agriculture department.

Distribution of Educational Materials

On 22nd June 2014, Jana Unnayan Samiti Tripura (JUST)



organized a program on distribution of educational materials to the non-formal school students under Smile Foundation Project. The program was conducted at Damdamia and Napali Basti non-formal Schools. 150 educational materials were

distributed to the students of both the schools. Few children came forward and shared their happiness for the educational materials given to them. The educational materials were distributed according to the classes and the needs of the students. The Coordinator Mr. Deepan Gurung spoke to the children on the importance of education comparing rural and urban education. He told the students that the materials were given by Smile Foundation and that the children were not to misuse them. Mrs. Mithu Rani, Miss. Swapana Gurung, Mr. Tonick and Mr. Tej Bahadur Teachers of SMILE Foundation distributed the materials and encouraged the children to continue their education.

Pope: Young People Are Not Just the Future of the Church, but the Present

Pope Francis told young people in Haemi, Korea, that they must not figuratively be 'asleep' because, as a beloved part of today's Church, they have a duty and responsibility to bring

their joy and optimism to the world. Speaking to the more than 50,000 young people from 23 countries gathered in the Castle of Haemi for the concluding Mass of the 6th Asian Youth Day, the Pope asserted that the active witness of young people is vital to the Church. "No one who sleeps can sing, dance or rejoice," he said. Reflecting on the theme of the 6th Asian Youth Day"Asian Youth! Wake up! The Glory of the Martyrs Is Upon You!"the Holy Father told them that one part of the theme represents a duty and a responsibility, whereas the other, a consolation. "The glory of the martyrs' shines upon you!" he said, not only consoles, but also strengthens because the martyrs' witness is proof that "the light of Christ's truth dispels all darkness," that he is "the light of our lives." The Gospel has the power to "purify," "elevate" and "perfect" Asia's strong cultural heritage, the Pope said, allowing young Catholics to still enjoy the many positive values of diverse Asian cultures. But at the same time they will be able to discern what is incompatible with their Catholic faith. "As young Christians," Francis said, "you are not only a part of the future of the Church; you are also a necessary and beloved part of the Church's present. You are the present of the Church," whether at "work, study, have begun a career or have answered calls to marriage, religious life or the priesthood." "In your Christian lives, you will find many occasions that will tempt you," he cautioned, but urged them in these situations to say "Lord, help me!" "Lord, help me!" and he will respond to "every plea for his help, with love, mercy and compassion." He also said the same must be done for others because "we are to be like Christ."

"Wake up!" means being vigilant and requires young people not to allow "pressures, temptations and sins of ourselves or others to dull sensitivity to the beauty of holiness, to the joy of the Gospel." Rather, the Pope said, God constantly invites his children "to be glad and sing for joy." Pope Francis concluded by directing them to take up this path, and declared: "Young people, Wake Up!" Next Asian Youth Day

Cardinal Gracias, the Archbishop of Bombay and President of the Federation of the Asian Bishops' Conference, told

thousands of young pilgrims gathered at Mass in Haemi, Korea, that the next Asian Youth Day will be held in Indonesia in 2017. The Cardinal made the announcement in his closing address of the 6th Asian Youth Day, during which he reflected on the event and expressed his gratitude to the Holy Father for his presence.

"Most Holy Father, It is my privilege to convey to you the sentiments of the tens of thousands of our youth assembled here. How happy we felt as you led us in this concluding Eucharist of the 6th Asian Youth day here in Daejeon, Korea. How inspired we felt with your message to us: Asian Youth, Wake up! The glory of the martyrs shines on you! How thrilled we are on realizing that we are entrusted with the challenge of transforming society. How enthusiastic we feel as we carry the joy of the Gospel to the ends of Korea, to the ends of Asia and to the ends of the world... We have spent five days of excitement, joy and playfulness but also of deep prayer, serious reflection and earnest exchange. But now after these five days in Daejeon we have rekindled our passion for the Gospel, revitalized our youthful spirit, and understood more deeply our baptismal consecration and the meaning of true discipleship... And so 'No' to an economy of exclusion, 'No' to an economy of selfishness, without ethics, 'No' to the spirit of materialism. 'No', 'No', 'No'. And a 'yes' to a personal encounter with Jesus whom we want to carry always with us. 'Yes' to the cry of the poor, the needy and the lonely and 'yes' to the world that eagerly waits for us."
