God wants us to embrace the truth that our problems, difficulties, and disappointments are storms on the sea of life that are **not** meant to sink us, but to sanctify us. Each 'storm' is an opportunity to grow closer to God. If everything were always perfect, we would become lazy, hedonistic, and selfish. It is through life's suffering and



hardships that we are given the opportunity to develop our trust in God and experience His love for us."

The Cross has been a source of attraction and strength and a challenge for the first disciples of Jesus and for all Christians down the centuries. In our own lives today, the Cross primarily means accepting God's love, which entails dying to our selfishness and pride. Suffering by itself does not necessarily mean the cross. We may suffer deeply, cursing God, people and our lot. Only when we

accept suffering in a spirit of deep faith, hope and love, can we say that we are participating in the mystery of the Cross. The mystery of the Cross is really an invitation to love! It is an invitation to true discipleship, "For, the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God." (1Cor. 1:18-25)

'Big City Blues'

On January 21, 2014 the Agartala Municipal Council turned into a Corporation. On the same day, the 42nd Statehood day of Tripura, 10 Nagar

Panchayats including Dharmanagar, Kailasahar, Ambassa, Khowai, Teliamura, Mohanpur,

Bishalgarh, Melaghar, Udaipur and Belonia in the sub-divisional towns were also promoted as Municipal Councils. These urban local bodies have been

upgraded and extended, official sources say, in order to give better services to the people of the State. Some even claim that Agartala, with its nearly half million population, is the biggest city in Northeast, after Guwahati!

That may be debatable but it's true Tripura has been through huge changes in the past decades. Distances have shrunk and more townships have developed. One now finds the narrow roads, sluggish traffic and ramshackle structures of old replaced by broader roads, faster cars, and taller buildings. In every nook and corner of the towns and townships signs of growth and



improved infrastructure are visible.

Unfortunately, these, however, have also widened the gap between the haves and the have-nots. Economic disparity, especially among the indigenous people of the state, is on the rise. A greater number of people have entered the elite club alright and many have moved up a notch or two on the

> social and economic matrix. This gives one the impression that the development process they're part of is without any lacuna whatsoever.

> This disturbing trend is most pronouncedly seen among the youth. Among them the glaring disparity is not confined merely to the economic sphere but in all areas of life. The

problem with such 'lop-sided' development is that the rich and the powerful get richer and more powerful while the poor get left out of the rat race.

The Gospels are filled with examples of Jesus' preferential treatment of the weak, the helpless, and the vulnerable. As individuals and communities that have the mandate to continue the mission of Jesus, we would do well to examine our attitude to such categories of people. Do we have some strategies in place to 'include' the normally excluded? Or do we, carried away by its many bells and whistles, bide our time naively singing the development song?
