The room in which he was living was in a terrible state of untidiness and neglect. There was no light in the room. The man hardly ever opened the blinds. He hadn't

had a friend in the world. She started to clean and tidy the room. At first he protested, saying, "Leave it alone. It's all right as it is." But she went ahead anyway. Under a pile of rubbish, she found a beautiful oil lamp but it was covered with dirt. She cleaned and polished it. Then she asked him, "How come you never light the lamp?" "Why should I light it?" he replied. "No one ever comes to see me. I never see anybody." "Will you promise to light it if one of my sisters comes to see you?" "Yes," he replied. "If I hear a human voice I'll light the lamp." Two of Mother Teresa's nuns began to visit him on a regular basis. Things gradually improved for him. Then one day he said to the nuns, "Sisters, I'll be able to manage on my own from now on. But do me a favor. Tell that first Sister, who came to see me, that the light she lit in my life is still burning." Happy Feast Day.

Teachers Day celebrated on the fifth of September in our country provides us an opportunity to focus our attention on

Teachers and their vocation. Teaching used to be considered our forte, although one can't anymore be sure if that's still the case. Whatever



that, the teaching-learning environment is familiar to us. Even if we are not directly involved in teaching, we know well enough how demanding a profession teaching is. And as time passes, it gets more demanding.

Let's focus on teaching in Schools. If teaching so-called 'normal' children is a challenging job, in the case of special

children – those that are challenged either physically, mentally, or intellectually, it's a thousand times harder. A casual chat about this with the Sisters at Ferrando Rehabilitation Centre, an Institution of the Missionary Sisters of Mary Help of Christians in our Diocese that runs a School for children with special needs, will make one aware of how demanding a task it is to teach special children. Such cases, the Sisters emphasize, are increasing at alarming proportions. More and more children today need treatment for speech impediments, hyperactivity, cerebral atrophy, etc. The reason for this rise in cases needs another discussion and so we leave it at that.

With RTE proposing Inclusive education for children with special needs, the task of all Teachers has become demanding in a new manner. By and large, our Institutions get good results and that's perhaps a reflection of the commitment of the Teachers in our Schools, although we are aware that results alone cannot be the index of their commitment and quality.

In Tripura, there has been a historic case involving Teachers, in which 10,323 Teachers lost their jobs and livelihood overnight. We as a body so much involved in teacher-related activities perhaps ought to have lent appropriate support to them in their moment of vulnerability.

The fishermen's struggle for justice, currently on in the southern part of the country, spearheaded by Bishops and Catholic Priests, comes to mind. Happy Teachers Day to all Teachers.

Joseph Kollamparambil (67), of the clergy of the Palai Eparchy and Fr. Thomas Padiyath (53), of the clergy of the Archieparchy of Changanacherry, as the Auxiliary Bishops of the Shamshabad Eparchy. This provision was made public on 25 August, 2022.

The centenary of the arrival of the first Salesians to Northeast India was commemorated and celebrated by the Salesians and the members of the Salesian





Flood Relief Response

The torrential rain on 18th and 19th of June 2022 had affected many parts of Tripura especially the low land areas near the Howrah River in West Tripura.



Thousands of people became homeless due to excessive rainfall. Two persons including a woman died due to ravage by the flood at Chandrapur and Khatakhal areas near to the Capital City. More than 2,000 people were displaced due to flood in Sadar Subdivision under West Tripura. To address the flood disaster and affected people, JUST intervened in the affected areas. After analyzing the situation JUST with the support of Caritas India decided to provide "Shelter Kits and Hygiene Kits" to 600 most affected families. Shelter Kits includes Tarpaulin, groundsheet, 2 sleeping mats, 2 mosquito nets and 9 meter nylon rope. The Hygiene Kits includes 10 washing soaps, 8 bathing soaps, 5 toothbrush, 1 toothpaste, 5 packets of sanitary napkins, 1 mug and 2 buckets. For the smooth distribution JUST took the help of local leaders and its partner NGOs. The distribution took place in the month of August 2022, at Aralia, Hrishi Para, Srilanka Basti, Boldakhal and Dashram Para under West Tripura.
