Pastor's Corner

Nonviolence in a Violent World

Gandhi Jayanti is on October 2, 2025, marking the national holiday to honor the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi.

This significant day commemorates the Father of the Nation and his principles of truth and non-violence, and is observed with prayer meetings, cultural programs, and

speeches across India. In a time when the world is riddled with wars, terrorism, and hate crimes, Gandhiji's principle of ahimsa (non-violence) serves as a moral compass.

Last week the UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres called on the international community to "silence the guns, end the suffering, build bridges, and create stability and prosperity," in a message on the International Day of Peace, observed annually on September 21. "Peace cannot wait," as the warring world is crying out for peace, said the UN chief. Around the world, lives are being ripped apart, childhoods extinguished, and basic human dignity discarded, amidst the cruelty and degradations of war, Guterres said. "We are seeing an explosion of conflict, International law flouted, and record numbers of people fleeing their homes," he said. "All they want is peace. Peace is everyone's business," said the top UN official, adding that the impacts of war ripple around the world. Guterres pointed out that while sustainable development supports peace. nine of the 10 countries struggling most with development are suffering conflict. He urged the international community to "quell the racism, dehumanization and misinformation that throw fuel on the fires of conflict."

Mahatma Gandhi was not just a leader of India's freedom movement but a visionary who preached non-violence, and self-reliance. You would agree that though he lived in a different era, his ideals remain timeless and more relevant than ever in today's troubled world. On this anniversary of Gandhi's birthday, some key Quotes on Peace are deemed relevant for reflection and action: "There is no path to peace; peace is the path." "An eye for an eye will only make the whole world blind." "Nonviolence is the greatest force at the disposal of mankind." "The day the power of love overrules the love of power, the world will know peace." His belief that "an eye for an eye makes the whole world blind" reminds us that peace can never be achieved through violence. Gandhiji is a guiding light for our personal lives, our communities, and our global society. In every challenge we face-violence, inequality, dishonesty, or ecological destruction-there is a Gandhian solution waiting to be rediscovered.


Month of the Rosary



The Catholic Church dedicates the month of October every year to the Holy Rosary, during which we are reminded that through Marv. Queen Peace, we are drawn closer to her Son. Pope Leo XIV invites the faithful to join in Rosary praying the every day during October to invoke God's gift of peace,

and announces a Rosary in St. Peter's Square on October 11 as part of the Jubilee of Marian Spirituality. "I invite everyone, each day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace—personally, in the family, and in community," he said. ACN Germany is organizing "One Million Children praying the Rosary" campaign on 7th October. Their international spiritual assistant, Father Anton Lässer said, "this campaign gives us the opportunity to bear powerful witness to our faith and to ask for the intercession of Mary, Queen of Peace."

Hemmed in on all sides by the hustle and bustle of the Pujas we step into October, a month so variegated, so unique. For us in the Diocese, the month has started off with an important event: the 10th Youth Convention of the Diocese. A large number of young people from all over the Diocese has gathered at St Xavier's Pathaliaghat under the banner of the Agartala Diocese Youth Commission. The Convention, focused on the Jubilee theme, 'Pilgrims of Hope', is expected to be a fitting finale to the many months of preparation that preceded it and also a memorable milestone urging the youth to forge ahead with hope on their pilgrimage of life.

For us Catholic, the Month of October is also the missionary month. Not only on Mission Sunday 19th October, but throughout the month we celebrate the Lord's command to "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation" (Mk 16:15), a mandate that has made the Church what it is today and also one that continues to urge us to 'go' even today. The theme of Mission Sunday this year is 'Missionaries of Hope among the peoples.' The Pope's message urges every Christian to keep "the spark of hope alive so that it can become a great fire, which enlightens and warms everyone around us..." That our Parishes observe Mission Sunday with great enthusiasm and fervour is surely a sign that our faithful have, over the years, become more aware of the deep significance of mission and their irreplaceable role in it.

October is also the month of the holy rosary for us Catholics. It is inspiring to see that many of our families, even those that have not made recitation of the rosary an essential part of their daily life, take up the beads in October. How widespread is the practice of the rosary among our faithful at other times seems to depend a great deal on how much importance and emphasis each parish gives to it. Considering the centrality of the rosary in the Catholic tradition, one certainly wishes that praying the rosary became a widespread practice in our diocese and a more regular practice in our families.

I end with a quote from St. Teresa of Child Jesus, the Patroness of the Missions: "I would like to travel all over the world to preach your name and plant your glorious Cross on the soil of the unbelievers; but, oh my Beloved, one mission wouldn't be enough for me, I would like at the same time to proclaim the Gospel in the five parts of the world and even in the most remote islands... I would like to be a missionary not only for a few years, but I would like to have been one since the creation of the world and to be one until the end of the ages..."

Sindukpathar Parish Shepherd's Pastoral Visit




