Victor Frankl, one of the great psychiatrists of the 20th century, survived the death camps of Nazi Germany.

His little book 'Man's Search for Meaning' is one of those life changing books. Frankl once told the story of a woman in the middle of the night to calmly inform him she was to commit suicide. Frankl kept her on the

phone and talked her through her depression, giving her reason after reason to carry on living. Finally she promised she would not take her life, and she kept her word. When they later met, Frankl asked which reason had persuaded her to live? "None of them" she told him. What then influenced her to go on living? Her answer was simple; it was Frankl's willingness to listen to her in the middle of the night. A world in which there was someone ready to listen to another's pain seemed to her a world in which it was worthwhile to live. Often, it is not a brilliant argument that makes a difference.

The Relationship between religion and Covid-19

Since the beginning of the pandemic, the relationship between religion and Covid-19 has been a tormented



one. During the first few months of the pandemic, says Michel Chambon, various media reported that religious places were not enforcing social distancing and, therefore, were responsible for the spread of the virus. Others claimed that naive beliefs cultivated by religious leaders were interfering with health policies. Whether in

Korea, India or the USA, religion was easily portrayed as a brake against containment strategies. For these observers, sanitizing States were our only saviors. Months later, the role played by religion during the pandemic appears more nuanced. In a time of isolation and distress, a vast number of people have turned toward religious practices and networks. Their motivations might greatly vary, but they illustrate the relevance of religion during a pandemic. +Lumen, CSC

having to skip the mega annual celebration that brings together the Diocese in a most beautiful manner, even if for a short time.


Held uninterruptedly since 2009 under the aegis of the laity organization of the Diocese, the procession has, over the years, evolved into a wonderful celebration of faith.

Sr. Joseline, FCC, died October 9, a day after she met with a road accident

The 66-year-old FCC nun died at GB Pant Hospital in Agartala on October 9. Bishop Lumen announced the death at 2:49 pm on the diocesan WhatsApp group. The Holy Cross prelate had earlier visited Sr. Joseline and asked his people to pray for her. Sr. Joseline was the Superior of St. Alphonsa Convent at Sindukpathar in South Tripura. The Tripura Times reported that a Goods Carrier had collided with a car carrying three



women, including two Clarist nuns, and a layman, on NH 8. All of them were injured and rushed to the hospital. The other nun, Sister Maria Therese, 73, fractured both the legs while others had milder injuries. The other companions in the car were Bina Thomas and

husband Tom, who are reportedly out of danger. Sister Joseline was working with the MSFS, who set up the Sindukpathar Parish in 2008. The Franciscan Clarist Congregation started its Agartala mission in 2011 and they have two communities. The other community is in East Harina, where Sr. Maria Therese is stationed. The Sisters are from the Sacred Heart Province of Ernakulam.

The Provincial from Kerala reached Agartala and took the mortal remains of Sister Joseline to the congregation's headquarters in Aluva, Kerala, for burial. En route to the airport the body was brought to the Cathedral Church where a large number of Priests, Religious and Laity gathered for the Mass of the Resurrection. Irudhaya Jothi, SJ



A walk down memory lane



It was in 1980 that I met Lumen Monteiro for the first time. The meeting took place at the Pune Railway Station and ever since our journey as friends continued non-stop. The years we spent together in

Pune and subsequently in Bengaluru laid the foundation for a lasting friendship. Along the way, Lumen became Father Lumen and then Bishop Lumen and though our physical locations have changed, our friendship has endured and is

something we continue to cherish and treasure.

Bishop Lumen has come across to me as a wonderful human being who is genuine to the core and is keenly interested in being at the service of others. What I have found most striking in him is his uncompromising commitment to his duties and responsibilities.

From our days at Bengaluru, I can recall numerous instances of his politely declining my tempting offer of a cup of coffee after a tiring Volleyball game at St. Mark's Road because he feared that he would be late for his next programme with his students at Museum Road, just a stone's throw away. He allowed no personal interests to come in the way of his duties and responsibilities.

Another outstanding aspect of Bishop Lumen's personality that I have always deeply appreciated is his simplicity. He is easy to befriend, has no airs about himself and is ready to serve 24x7 without counting the cost. He welcomes everyone and loves being with people attending to their spiritual and temporal needs. As a Bishop, he makes it a point to reach out to people even in the most remote areas of his diocese. His calendar of activities stands as a clear testimony to his commitment to tending his sheep. I have often found it impossible to reach him over phone as he

would be in some remote village engaged in serving the people there. He has shown by example that being Bishop is a call to selfless service in the footsteps of the Master.

Building up a new diocese from scratch – physically and spiritually – can indeed be a daunting task. Lack of funds, priests and proper infrastructure are but some of the challenges that a new Bishop would face, and Bishop Lumen was no exception. But what indeed was exceptional about him that helped him surmount these challenges were his people skills and administrative acumen, besides his complete

dependence on the God who provides. With his motto "Lead us onward", Bishop Lumen, in all humility, allowed himself to be led forward by the light of Christ resulting in the diocese of Agartala being what it is today.



25 years as a Bishop is an

important milestone in Bishop Lumen's life that deserves celebration. His vocation as Priest and Bishop has given him the opportunity to celebrate life in the service of God and people – a task he has been doing with total dedication and commitment in a spirit of true love. I take this opportunity to wish Bishop Lumen God's continued blessings, in every form that he requires, as he continues his mission to make life more meaningful and less burdensome for the people he serves.

Dear Bishop Lumen, you are different, and you make a difference! You are blessed, and you are a blessing! May the good Lord lead you onward to your Golden Jubilee and beyond. God bless.

MY JOURNEY WITH BISHOP LUMEN

I landed at the land of Bamboo, Tripura in the



year 2002. Since then I have been associated with Bishop Lumen at different capacities. However, my close association with him began from Gandacherra when I became the Parish Priest in 2006.

Gandacherra then, was considered by the people as place of punishment transfer, for its remoteness, underground activities and lack of facilities. Every visit of Bishop Lumen to Gandacherra, those days be it planned or



unplanned, had rejuvenating impact on the mission and personally for me.

One of the inerasable memories of his pastoral visits to Gandacherra, was our stay at a tiny Bamboo hut in the year 2008. He was invited for the inauguration of a new substation at Ratanagar a remote village 20 km away from Gandacherra. After travelling from Agartala in the morning via Ambassa with two escorts, he reached Gandacherra at 6.30 in the evening. The strenuous and tiring journey did not deterred him to reach to the substation for the night stay in a Bamboo hut with no facility at all. That night hostel children presented a cultural programme, following day was the inauguration of the new substation. To my amazement he just adjusted with whatever the villagers provided. This incident was great inspiration for me to adapt to the situation and his commitment and love for the pastoral ministry is always commendable.





It was from 2013, I had much close Association with him as the Director of JUST, the Social service wing of the Diocese. JUST has established a name for itself with the hard works of my predecessors. However, with the ever encouraging support, and active involvement of Bishop Lumen we could take JUST to a new heights in terms of variety of interventions in multiple sectors, and net working. His interests in field visits be it be in Caritas India Project area as the chairman or the project villages of JUST, always gave us new impetus to take the development interventions to the next level.

He always believes in networking and combined efforts, thus, able to generate synergy to achieve the aims and objectives of institutions and organizations. He is straight forward in expression yet able to take along people in decision making. His participatory decision making ability has been the strength and secret of the success of his Shepherdship for the past 25 silver years. He is the person who least bothers about his health and comforts when it comes to socio pastoral commitment. After his major surgery in 2019 in Chennai, Doctors advised him one month bed rest but he could not resist his enthusiasm for the pastoral commitment that he traveled to Telengana on the 15th day of post surgery recovery to ordain Fr. Pravin.

As he has faithfully walked 25 Silver years in shepherding the Diocese, wish him good health in the coming years too.
