Pastor's Corner

God's Sense of Humor and my Response!

"If we genuinely trust scripture, our own experience, and our own sanity, we can only conclude that God has a sense of humor, and a robust and sneaky one at that", says Ron

Rolheiser OMI, in his recent blog of 6th June. He continues, "A generation ago, Peter Berger wrote a remarkable little book entitled, A Rumor of Angels. Unlike Aguinas, Anselm, Descartes, and a number of renowned philosophers, he didn't try to "prove" the existence of God through logic and argumentation. Rather, he simply examined a number of very ordinary human experiences and pointed to what's hidden inside and behind the walls of those experiences. Now, one of the experiences Berger highlights is the experience of humor. Here's his thesis: no matter how oppressive and dire the circumstance, human beings always have the capacity to make light of it, to view it through the prism of irony and humor. For example, martyrs have joked with their executioners and, no doubt, there was some banter, sarcasm, irony, and bitter humor at times inside extermination camps. The fact that people can do this, and do in fact do it, shows that there is always something transcendent inside us, something over which no human oppression has power, something that sets us above any situation within which we find ourselves. Our sense of irony and humor manifests that something in our soul sets us above anything that can beset us.

If God not only has a sense of humor but is also the author of humor itself, then humor is an important quality within sanctity and holiness. What makes for wholeness, maturity, holiness, love, and for the kind of person you want beside you at the table, here and at the eternal one in heaven? Certainly,

you want someone who manifests the qualities that Jesus asked for in the Sermon on the Mount - along with a warm, playful, and mischievous sense of humor.'

"Keeping your funny side up won't resolve all conflicts but it will prove a preventative to destructive community arguments," says Dr. Archana Bnhate. So let's try to make ourselves laugh whether we feel it or not. There are many occasions in daily life which call for laughter; and I, the undersigned, am constantly looking Above all let us learn to laugh at out for them. ourselves! As Goodman says, "it's important to take your job seriously, but take yourself lightly". Self-humor can diffuse a stressful situation, flipping it back on itself.

Incessant Rain causes Water Logging and Landslides

The incessant rains last week affected the lives of thousands in Tripura, hundreds of thousands in



neighboring Assam and Meghalaya, and millions in neighboring Bangladesh. Floods and landslides in the State and waterlogging in the capital City of Agartala left us marooned. Several hectares of crops have been inundated, animals have been washed away, and houses

have been under water. Landslides on the National Highway has breached the road in several places, and Tripura, which was cut off from the rest of the country, is slowly inching back to normalcy!

A couple of Youth that attended the recently held Logesong workshop, brought to the attention of the participants a dilemma connected to Church attendance many young people were struggling with. They pointed out that of late, many competitive examinations are held on Sundays. Competitive examinations are like a springboard to the future and many of their long-cherished dreams hinge on getting through competitive examinations. Sitting for these means foregoing Sunday Mass. They are by no means comfortable about it. They find themselves in a fix.

Others added that it is not just competitive examinations that are held on Sundays but Government department-related meetings too. What is more, it is mandatory for those employees concerned to attend these Sunday meetings.

Needless to say, these Sunday assignments deprive them of the Church.

In these evidently changing times, are there middle paths or alternatives that we need to explore, so that such arbitrary and insensitive steps by powers that be, need not necessarily deprive our faithful of their most important weekly worship? Perhaps an additional Mass at a time that suits those for whom it is meant? Some adjustment of the time, and perhaps, even the day, if it's required. The bottom line is to do whatever it takes to ensure that Mass is not missed during the week.

If in our parishes, both the Pastor and the faithful take daring and resolute steps in this regard, there are ways of getting around these and yet more obstacles that may come in the future, perhaps.

News Briefs from the Diocese

Diocesan Synod renews Church in Tripura

Agartala, June 11, 2022: Nine months of the intense synodal meetings at different levels ended June 11 with the diocesan pre-Synodal meeting in



Agartala. As many as 92 representatives of laity, catechists, women's groups, youth religious and priests attended the day-long prayer, reflection, discernment and planning for the future of the Church in Tripura. The participants have resolved to make the spirit of Synodality, "Journeying together"

beyond the diocesan synod meeting into their daily lives.

"The meeting provided an opportunity for diverse members of the Diocese to come together for a liturgical celebration, pray together, and reflect on their experience of the Synodal process," said Jesuit Father Irudhaya Jothi, the contact person for the Synodal preparation in the Diocese of Agartala. He noted that Diocese has completed different stages of the Synodal process. "It is time now to listen to the feedback from the synodal consultation meetings across the Diocese and dialogue about the local Church's current reality, read the signs of the times and discern the Holy Spirit's call," he added. The priest, who introduced the art of active listening and intentional speaking, expressed satisfaction at the outcome of the process that passed the diocesan synthesis of pre-Synodal document.

Manai Ranglong, a woman participant, said the diocesan synod meeting and the pre-synodal documents expressed her feelings and aspirations. "It is time we owned up synod decisions such as promotion of local vocations and formation of the children and youth in the faith," said the representative of Bagbasa, the

northernmost Parish of the Diocese.

The Diocese of Agartala was among the first to discuss the Synod on Synodality starting in September 2021. Bishop Lumen Monteiro of Agartala pointed out that the Church in Tripura has until now stressed the faith formation of the laity and the expansion of the Kingdom of God. A group of lay people said the diocese's "infancy period has been a bit prolonged and it was time to encourage lay leaders in the Church."

A challenge for the Tripura Church is the presence of the Syro-Malabar and Syro-Malankara Rites, who view the Oriental Catholics as different denominations. "This creates a certain amount of misunderstanding; hence proper education of the laity is needed," Father Jothi said. Soon after the synodal meeting, Bishop Monteiro met with Bishop Raphael Thattil, of the Eparchy of Shamshabad, under which the Silchar Syro-Malabar Catholic Mission operates in Tripura. Father Jothi says much good would have happened if Bishop Thattil too had attended the Agartala diocesan synod. "It was a missed opportunity," he added. By Matters India Reporter

Human trafficking or modern day slavery is a growing global crisis. No State in North-East India is

Sr. Prema Chowallur SCC, the Vice President of Amrat Talitha Kum India, shared about the Network of religious Sisters who are actively involved in preventing and rescue works, related to antihuman trafficking in India.
