On 17th December the parish celebrated Christmas. number of people from different villages gathered and offered home prepared sweets which were distributed after the Mass as the faithful wished one another 'advance Christmas'. Then the leaders organized a Christmas Peace Rally with two wheelers, cars and a bus to Aichukni Pohor. The village is a government established colony with the Reang and Molsom tribes. Originally they were brought in from Attaramura villages and they are very poor. We them Christmas through messages and songs and distributed blankets to 20 families. From there the motorcade went to Kulai Gantachara another 3 kilometers away and distributed blankets for 30 families. With prayers, songs and dances we concluded our 'advance Christmas' and Peace Rally.
