With Peter, always

In the Pastor's Corner I have posted Andrea Tornielli's poignant writeup 'With Peter, always...' on the 11th anniversary of Pope Francis' election to the papacy and his constant calls for the world to follow the path of mercy and peace. I wish you all a joy - filled EASTER season

In the deafening silence of diplomacy, in a landscape marked by the increasingly evident absence of political initiative and leadership capable of betting on peace, while the world has begun a mad race to rearm, allocating sums that would suffice to ensure basic healthcare twice over for all the inhabitants of the earth and significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions, the lone voice of Pope Francis continues to plead for weapons to be silenced and call for the courage to foster paths of peace. The Pope continues to call for a ceasefire in the Holy Land, where the ruthless massacre of October 7 carried out by Hamas terrorists was followed by the tragic carnage that continues to be perpetrated in Gaza.

He continues to call for weapons to fall silent in the tragic war that erupted in the heart of Christian Europe, in Ukraine destroyed and martyred by the bombings of the aggressor Russian army. He continues to invoke peace in other parts of the world where conflicts are fought with unspeakable violence, the forgotten conflicts that make up increasingly large pieces of a global conflict.

The Bishop of Rome enters the twelfth year of his pontificate in a dark hour, with the fate of humanity at the mercy of rulers incapable of assessing the consequences of their decisions, who seem to surrender to the inevitability of war. With clarity and realism, he says that "he is stronger who sees the situation, who thinks of the people," that is, "who has the courage to negotiate," because "negotiating is a courageous word," of which one should not be ashamed.

Pope Francis, challenging the misunderstandings of those both near and far, continues to place the sanctity of life at the center of attention, expressing closeness to innocent victims and denouncing the dirty economic interests that move the strings of wars cloaked in hypocrisy.

A quick look at these last eleven years of history makes clear the prophetic value of Peter's voice. The alarm, first raised two decades ago, about the third world war fought piecemeal. The social encyclical *Laudato si'* (2015) showed how climate change, migrations, wars, and an economy that kills are interconnected phenomena that can only be addressed through a global perspective. The great encyclical on human fraternity (*Fratelli tutti*, 2020) pointed the way to building a

new world based on fraternity, once again removing any excuse for abusing the name of God to justify terrorism, hatred, and violence.


There is also the constant reference in his magisterium to mercy, which weaves the entire fabric of a missionary pontificate. The testimony of mercy, therefore, represents a fundamental element of this "saving love of God" which is "prior to moral and religious obligation." In other words, those who have not yet come into contact with the Christian reality, as Pope Benedict XVI had already lucidly observed in May 2010, will hardly be struck and fascinated by the affirmation of norms and moral obligations, by the insistence on prohibitions, by the meticulous lists of sins,



by condemnations, or by nostalgic appeals to the values of the past.At the origin of welcome. closeness, tenderness, and accompaniment, at the origin of a Christian community capable of embracing and listening, there is the echo of mercy that has been experienced and

that one seeks – despite a thousand limitations and failures – to return. If we read with these eyes the Pope's gestures, even those that have provoked in some the same scandalized reactions that Jesus' gestures provoked two thousand years ago, one discovers their profound evangelizing and missionary force.

Church and Elections

With a Lok Sabha election ominously approaching and the intensity of emotions and campaigns soaring to unexpected crescendos, it seems apt to examine what the attitude of the Church to politics is. The Catholic Church teaches that Catholics should participate in the political process, be informed voters, and encourage elected officials to act on behalf of the common good. However, there are limits to official Church political activity. The Church does not endorse, promote, or oppose political parties, their candidates, or their platforms. It also doesn't allow its member lists, buildings, or other resources to be used for political purposes.

The Church also doesn't advise members on how to vote, or direct party leaders or government officials in their duties. Instead, it teaches the gospel of Jesus Christ, with the understanding that living these principles can limit hostilities and contention.

The political scenario in the State of Tripura is no less volatile than it is elsewhere in the country. With an election approaching, various political parties bring to the public domain the aspirations of the people through campaigning and canvassing in the hope of garnering votes.

Unlike politicians who urge people to vote for their party, the Church desists from endorsing or opposing any party. But it does encourage everyone to cast their vote and be informed voters because that is consistent with the gospel values of freedom, dignity, and choice of the individual the Church has always promoted.

It is normal for the local Church to have in its fold adherents of various political parties. That does not at all affect the identity of the particular Church as a union of believers in the Lord united in heart and soul.

On the other hand, it is a powerful witness to the unifying nature and power of faith when members belonging to different ideologies, even opposed ones, come together to celebrate the faith as brothers and sisters united in the Lord.

In that way, even in times when one is tempted to think of political power and allegiance as the ultimate realities that matter, the Church bears witness to values that transcend political identity and



political identity and aspirations.

As the months of April and May unleash the dance of democracy throughout our great nation, it is our prayer that democracy and all it entails will hold sway and that this mammoth exercise will bring forth what is best for our country and all its people.

JUST organized a training program on Rights-Based and Leadership Skills at Swarupa Colony under Karbook Block, on 15th March. 25 community members gathered to engage in insightful discussions and collaborative efforts towards beneficial outcomes. The facilitator was Mr. Pradip Minj, a senior Government Teacher in the program. The facilitator shared some significant societal matters, commencing with a reflection on the vital role of mothers in nurturing families and communities. The facilitator also discussed on environmental stewardship, with discussions centering on the importance of preserving one's natural surroundings. The "Papa Francisco



A boat carrying Christ's hope and consolation on the banks of the Amazon River, the "Papa Francisco" Hospital boat tends to some 5,200 people's health and spiritual needs, which Sister Marcia Lopes

Assis serves aboard in the Juruti-Pará region of the Amazon Forest in Brazil.

Sister Marcia Lopes Assis belongs to the Congregation of the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. She carries out her pastoral work at the Nuestra Señora de la Salud Parish in Juruti-Pará in the Amazon. The parish is part of the Diocese of Óbidos, in Brazil. Sister Marcia shares that her "vocation has been a missionary one from the very beginning", and that throughout her journey, God has always surprised her in every missionary experience he has granted her. Crossing the Amazon River, explains Sister Marcia, "is no easy task. When we arrived at the community of Santa Rita, I was greeted by the children, who were very timed and frightened by the arrival of a stranger, but we soon became timid and frightened by the arrival of a stranger, but we soon became very close. Some are afraid because they confuse me with a nurse or a dentist; others call me teacher, but most of them are captivated and stay dentist; others call me teacher, but most of them are captivated and stay close, saying they too will be religious when they grow up."As a token of their gratitude, the children offered to teach the religious sister to row. "I found the best teachers among the children," she adds. The Sister is part of a group of 35 collaborators who navigate the "Pope Francis Hospital Boat." The Team includes 10 doctors, two dentists, and one priest, Fr. Alfonso Lambert. It is a home of welcoming, of striving, of defending life, and of evangelization, simplicity, and love. A day on the boat starts very early in the morning with Holy Mass. Then the professionals treat the people according to their symptoms.
"I am in charge of welcoming the families, evangelizing the children and accompanying the sick after a surgery or taking them to their medical visits if they cannot get there on their own. I distribute the Eucharist to the sick," says Sister Marcia.
