A WORD ABOUT 'FAMILY PRAYER'

On 21st January 2024, the Sunday of the Word of God, the Diocese of Agartala commenced the 'Year of the Word of God'. According to the instructions of the Bishop, all the parishes in the Diocese ushered in the special year with due solemnity. It is a happy coincidence that Pope Francis has consecrated 2024 as the Year of Prayer in preparation for the Jubilee of 2025. Happy coincidence because one so well complements the other.

In the Pastoral Letter announcing the Year of the Word of God, our Bishop also mentioned a variety of ways in which we could engage with the Word of God this year. He spoke about the need of Reading the Word of God, Reflecting on it, and Praying with it in the form of Lectio Divina, etc. No doubt, engaging with the Word of God, is essentially about prayer. The Bishop also invited parents and children to make the reading of the Word of God, a habit in their families. 



St. Xavier's Pathaliaghat clinches National Prize



The Diocese of Agartala is overjoyed with appreciation for the "Brass Band-Girls" Team of St. Xavier's Higher Secondary School Pathaliaghat, for winning the third prize in the All India School Band Competition held on 21st and 22nd January, 2024 at the National Stadium, New Delhi. The Band Team consists of 25 girl students aged between 11 and 16 and studying in grades 6-8. To reach the national level competitions the Team had to win three earlier stages: the District, the State and the Zonal stage. At the Zonal stage, held in Bhubaneswar on December 22, the Tripura Team emerged first in the Eastern Region, beating several teams from the region comprising Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal and Northeastern States. Continuous hard work and strong determination from the School management and participants is clearly evident from their outstanding performance which is a praise worthy thing.

SHG CLUSTER EXPOSURE VISITS



As part of the livelihood intervention JUST organized an exposure visit for the SHG's of Ganganagar R.D. Block to Tuikarmaw, South Tripura on 9th& 10th January, 2024. The purpose was to encourage the Women to undertake income-generation activities as alternative opportunities. 40 Cluster Members accompanied by three 3 Staff and the Project Coordinator made the group visits. The president of Chwng Mari Society first briefed about the functioning and activities of their Society. Then the group visited the Rubber cultivation of the Society. The visiting group also went for the field visit to have a firsthand experience of the income generation activities of these SHGs. The group made use of every chance to interact with the Members of income generating SHGs and even tried their hand at testing the quality of the products. They were also very much amused to see the shop set up on the street of Tuikarmaw to sell their self-made products. The SHG Members were motivated and shared that they specifically found the knowledge sharing on income generation activities very interesting and will try to adopt the same and practice within their Groups as well.

Training on Sugarcane Juice Extraction & Jaggery making process



JUST conducted a training on Sugarcane Juice extraction and Jaggery making for the Staff on 16th and 17th January at Old Darlong Basti, Kathalcherra. The Resource Person was Mr. Lura Darlong, specialized in Jaggery making. The purpose of training was to encourage our Small Holder Farmers to take up Sugarcane cultivation for their income generation activities as their alternative opportunities. First the Staff are given training so that they can replicate this model in the field for the farmers. The Resource Person shared that the process comprises of 'crushing of sugarcane for juice extraction, filtration and boiling of juice for concentration and then cooling and solidifying to give jiggery blocks'. The juice is extracted in a conventional crusher. This is then filtered and boiled in shallow iron pans. Mr. Lura also showed the practical process to the Staff from extraction of juice to making of jaggery. JUST plans to take this model in the field which will be a beneficial opportunity for the Small Holder Farmers.
