Seventh quality: It writes till the very end. Be useful and productive till your dying day.


The seven qualities of a Pencil have been explained as a guiding philosophy of one's life which I thought could serve as a resolution for the New Year.

Silver Jubilee Celebrations at Agartala

The Diocese celebrated its jubilee along with the



first Bishop Lumen Monteiro CSC on 4th December 2021 at Holy Cross School grounds in Agartala. One hundred girls representing 19 tribal groups, attired in their culture lead the celebrant with an entrance dance synergizing different moves for a single music rhythmically. Eleven Bishops concelebrated along with the Jubilarian Bishop Lumen Monteiro with little more than one hundred Priests and Nuns. A short felicitation program after the Eucharist was well managed by the lay faithful effectively and the youth lead from the front.

The preparations for the Jubilee celebration started in 2019 with very many renewal programs for Children, Students, Youth, SCC Groups, Laity and Religious. But due to Covid19 indefinite lockdowns some of the programs were organized in a subdued manner. With all the restrictions of the number of participants and keeping in mind the Covid protocols, the jubilee celebration was organized with just around 1000 participants comprising of lay faithful of Tripura, Religious, Priests and the Bishops of Northeast region. Holy Cross father Shaji Mandapathikunnel Lucka, the Convener of the Jubilee Committee, who is the vice-Principal of Holy Cross College in Agartala said, "I am very happy with the collaboration and support from the Laity, Religious and Priests of the Diocese since day one" and added "I am grateful to all." The Silver Jubilarian Bishop Lumen Monteiro expressed his gratitude and joy in steering the Diocese from her inception. Expressing his sentiments he said, today my "Gratitude to God, Gratitude to my collaborator Priests and Religious, and Gratitude to the lovely people of the Diocese". Fr. Jothi, SJ
