# Pastor's Corner

#### TRIBAL LIVES MATTER... MANIPUR MATTERS!

The situation in Manipur continues to be grim after almost three months of violence which has claimed so

many lives and caused untold misery across the State.In solidarity with the appeals from the CBCI and the Archdiocese of Imphal, we in the Diocese of Agartala have responded with our mite to mitigate this humanitarian crisis by way of prayer and financial support. I extend my appeal for peace and pray for a solution in the troubled State of Manipur.

Here are excerpts from a thought-provoking article by Archbishop Menamparampil in Indian Currents.

It is calculated that internet shutdowns like those in Manipur and Punjab by law enforcement agencies have cost the nation \$1.9 billion during January-June period. Such communication disruptions weaken economic

activities. Modiji, who might be less moved by the loss of human lives than the reduction of market gains, could be invited to take some initiative in settling affairs in Manipur to prevent further economic loss. Jairam Ramesh



says the way Modi has "deliberately ignored Manipur" in her moment of agony is shocking, totally incomprehensible.

"Tribal lives matter" pleads P. Sainath at Xavier Institute of Social Service, Ranchi, echoing the African American call "Black Lives Matter" after George Floyd's death. Pradyot Kishore Debbarma of Tripura sent out a similar message recently, referring to his own situation, "Don't play with the emotions of tribals! Their fight is for their rights, lands, language". They are willing to pay any price.

Modiji remains unmoved. He coolly raises the issue of Uniform Civil Code and diverts the nation's attention from the tragedies of Manipur. Is he deliberately adding insult to injury by keeping the Manipur horrors as a non-issue? It was not so with Vajpayee. People remember how he had expressed profound grief in 2001 when there broke out a conflict in Manipur. He was faithful to his Raj Dharma. What Rahul calls a 'horrible tragedy' is a non-issue for Modi...

In the context of these trends, China passes a new foreign relations law that speaks of "amity, sincerity and mutual benefit" with neighbors. Amazing! No one takes these words in Xi's mouth seriously. But words have power on their own. The other day Biden called XI a 'tyrant', Putin a 'pariah' in reference to the mutiny of Yevgeny Prigozhin. But Modi remained a worthy partner. Their business instincts seem to coincide. When wealth is exchanged, differences disappear...at least for a while. When flattery is exchanged, failures are forgotten. People change when interests coincide. Kamala Harris spoke of the great spiritual and philosophical messages that India passed on to the rest of the world. Respect for life has always remained central to them all. Then, "Tribal lives matter. Kuki lives matter. Meitei lives matter. Indian lives matter. Human lives matter". Today our interests ought to coincide, not with the exchange of dollars and rupees, but with hearts and minds united in shared human interests. Manipur matters.

#### THE MANIPUR MAYHEM

Some Seventy years ago William Golding observed that 'man produces evil as a bee produces honey'.

In his celebrated novel, Lord of the Flies (1954) a group of children undergo loss of innocence on an Edenic island, where a mysterious and fearful "beast" causes them to divide into factions, with murderous outcomes. They descent from civilization to absolute savagery. Manipur seems to prove that Golding's "evil as a bee" remark was frighteningly spot on.

Initially, Manipur shocked us, then it benumbed us, and then gradually, we got used to it – morning after morning browsing through the day's share of gore, brutality, and shame, routinely, almost expectantly. The contours of violence have gone berserk in this neighboring state to such an extent that adequate words are not easy to find – to describe the anguish and pain of those at the receiving end. 'And much it grieved my heart to think, what man has made of man!'

Manipur is a test. Amidst rallies, protest marches, debates, discussions, and the deafening silence and shocking indifference of those that matter, there are numerous theories doing the rounds - plausible ones, probable ones. We too could delude ourselves that the intellectual angst we feel is adequate action. However, angst alone, whatever its degree and nature, hardly help alleviate the indescribable pain and suffering thousands have gone through and



relocated to.

It's not easy either, to decipher why things are going the way they do. Is it a case of some simple plans, slightly mischievous ones, gone horribly

wrong or is it some pre-scripted agenda playing itself out to the letter?

It is sad that 'delay' - intentional or otherwise, has been a leitmotif in the Manipur conundrum – delayed intervention, delayed response, delayed knowledge – the case of the horrific video that surfaced after about 80 days is a case in point. But the truth is that certain things cannot wait. Hunger, want, sickness, misery, brokenness, and the uncertain future of thousands who live in the relief camps under ramshackle arrangements need immediate attention. As we continue to pray for Manipur, we realize that solidarity is the need of the hour and therefore, generously reach out to these needy neighbors.

Henceforth, 3rd May 2023 shall remain etched in the psyche of the Manipuri population, as 8th June 1980 has become a date to remember in Tripura's chequered history.

# Our Sincere Congratulations to Bishop-elect Fr. Ferdinand Dkhar New Bishop of Jowai

His Holiness Pope Francis has appointed Fr. Ferdinand Dkhar (61), currently the Administrator of the Diocese of Jowai, Meghalaya, Northeast India, as the Bishop of Jowai on July 8, 2023. His episcopal Ordination will be at Jowai on 1st October, 2023. The See of the Diocese of Jowai became vacant when Bishop Victor Lyngdoh was appointed as the Archbishop of Shillong on December 28, 2020. Fr. Ferdinand Dkhar will be the third Bishop of the Diocese after Bp. Vincent Kympat (2006-2011) and Bp. Victor Lyngdoh (2016-2020). Jowai Diocese was erected in 2006, bifurcating it from the Archdiocese of Shillong. It is 64 kilometers away from Shillong, and has a Catholic population of 1,20,275 in 23 parishes.

#### The United Christian Forum of North East India

Guwahati, July 21, 2023: The United Christian Forum of North East India has expressed its disgust, pain, and condemnation at what it says was a horrifying incident that occurred in Manipur State. "A video recently surfaced on social media showing two Kuki women being paraded naked by a mob that has been confirmed by the media and FIR of the incident that took place on the said date, just a day after the ongoing clashes in Manipur began. Although, the women were paraded naked May 4 at B Phainom, a village in Kangpokpi district, the incident came to light only on July 19.

The incident, the forum says, is nothing short of barbaric and inhumane. The forum and Christians of northeastern India "stand in solidarity with the victims and their families during this traumatic time. We extend our heartfelt sympathies and prayers for their healing and recovery," says the statement issued by forum spokesperson Allen Brooks.

The forum has urged the federal and Manipur governments, along with statutory bodies such as the National Commission for Women, to take immediate cognizance of the "appalling crime and take all necessary measures to ensure justice is served swiftly and fairly. We expect nothing less than the strictest punishment for those responsible for this heinous act."

It offered prayers and support to families affected by the ongoing clashes in Manipur. "We appeal to all parties involved to exercise restraint, engage in peaceful dialogue, and find an amicable resolution to the conflict."

#### 37TH WORLD YOUTH DAY

#### **AUG. 1- 6 WORLD YOUTH DAY IN LISBON, PORTUGAL**

More than 400,000 young people have registered for the Aug. 1-6 youth jamboree in Lisbon, Portugal — including a delegation from Ukraine and one from Russia — that culminates with a visit by the Pope. Pope John Paul II initiated the first World Youth Day in 1986.

World Youth Days have long been known to be celebratory occasions — a week of concerts and rambunctious youth festivals, along with daily catechesis and prayer services — but looming large over this event will be how the Portuguese church, and Francis in particular, confronts the sobering reality of abuse.

The socio-religious developments in Portugal since the 1974 revolution have mirrored the secularizing trends in North America and Europe. In many respects, combatting those trends was why Pope John Paul II started World Youth Day, a message that was reiterated by Pope Benedict XVI, who also used his messages at World Youth Day to warn against rising tides of secularism and disbelief.
