Pastor's Corner

Chandrayaan on the Moon

We in Agartala celebrated Chandrayaan-3 on the Moon along with the rest of the country after an Indian-built lunar lander touched down on the moon's surface on August 23. "India is now on the moon and the success belongs to all humanity", Prime Minister Narendra Modi said as Chandrayaan-3 landed successfully on the lunar surface. "The progress made by our scientists and engineers in the field of space research is truly commendable and fills our hearts with pride," said the CBCI President. Similarly, Pope Francis has spoken about space exploration — recalling the 50th anniversary of the moon landing in 2019, when he encouraged Catholics to look to that great event for inspiration to overcome injustices.

The first seeds of space research: One fine Saturday morning in early 1960s, Rev. Dr. Peter Bernard Pereira – the then Bishop of Trivandrum - had a strange guest who had come to his house with a stranger request. The Reverend listened to him patiently but did not respond immediately. Instead, he invited the man to join the Mass the next day. At the end of the Sunday Mass, the Bishop spoke to the assembled crowd, "My children, I have a famous scientist with me who wants our church and the place I live for the work of space science and research. Science seeks truth that enriches human life. The higher level of religion is spirituality...." As narrated by Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, the Bishop's question was greeted by an unsettling silence, and as Dr. Vikram Sarabhai waited eagerly, the church finally reverberated with a loud and hearty 'Amen' from all present! A grateful Dr. Sarabhai and team promptly swung into action. The entire village of fisher folks was relocated nearby, and a new Church was built for the faithful in 100 days flat. The erstwhile St. Mary Magdalene Church and Rev. Pereira's living quarters located strategically on the magnetic equator and blessed with a narrow ribbon of very strong electro jet current (therefore making it ideal for studying the ionosphere) - thus became the Thumba Equatorial Rocket Launching Station where the first seeds of Indian space research were sown amidst infrastructural constraints unthinkable by rocket scientists anywhere else in the world.

As the eponymous lander 'Vikram' touched down near the lunar south pole today with its aptly named rover 'Praggyan' (wisdom), here's remembering that distant weekend when

two leaders, at two seemingly opposite ends of the ideological spectrum, converged on the same grand vision of the future so that one day the sky could no longer be the limit for India!

Radha krishnan, a respected Philosopher and Teacher, who also served as the President of India from 1962 to 1967. 


St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta

The Feast Day of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta is on 5th September. She is the Patron of World Youth Day. Born in 1910 in Albania, Mother Teresa founded the Missionaries of Charity in 1950 in the Archdiocese of Calcutta. Subsequently, in 1963, she founded the Missionaries of Charity Brothers, in 1976 the Contemplative branch of the Sisters, in 1979 the Contemplative Brothers, and in 1984 the Missionaries of Charity Fathers. Numerous awards, beginning with the Indian Padmashri Award in 1962 and the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. honored her work, while an increasingly interested media began to follow her activities. She received both, prizes and attention, for the glory of God and in the name of the poor. "On 5th September 1997, Mother Teresa's earthly life came to an end. She was given the honor of a state funeral by the Government of India and her body was buried in the Mother House of the Missionaries of Charity. Her tomb quickly became a place of pilgrimage and prayer for people of all faiths, rich and poor alike. Mother Teresa was beatified by Pope John Paul II on October 19, 2003. St. Teresa of Calcutta was canonized by Pope Francis on September 4, 2016 in a ceremony that was witnessed by tens of thousands of people, including 1, 500 homeless people from across Italy.





Chapel blessed at Tauyongkho Para





He said, "It was the showcase of inbuilt anger that was protested peacefully for the injustice done to the tribals of Manipur".
